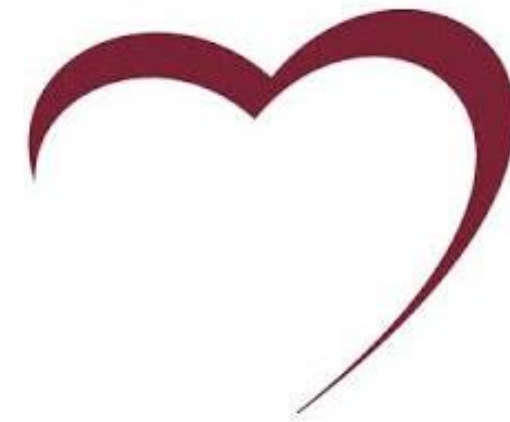
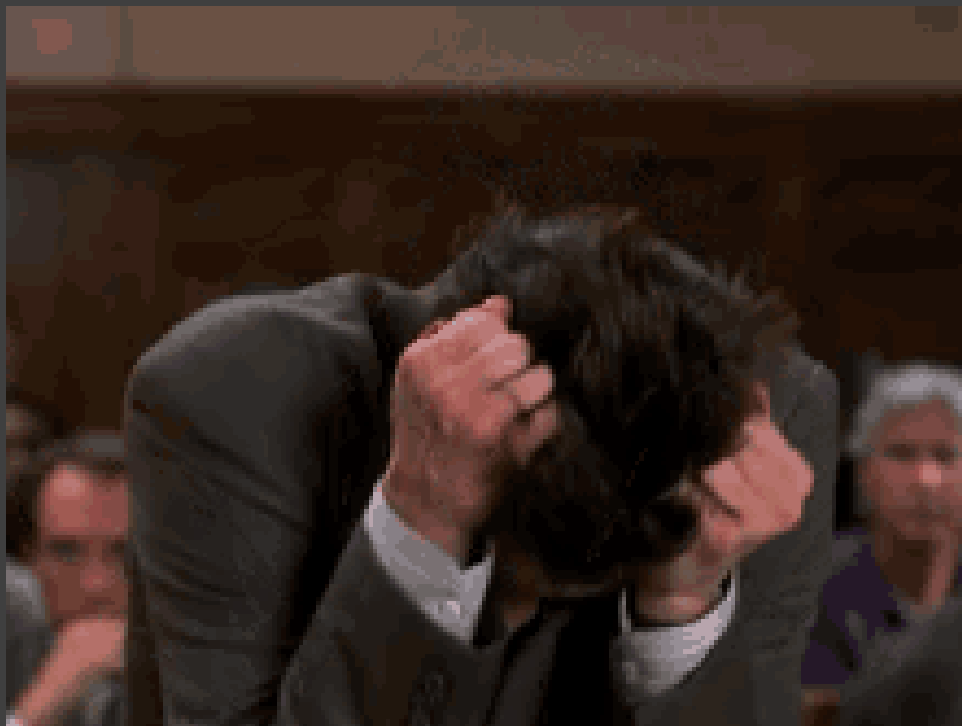

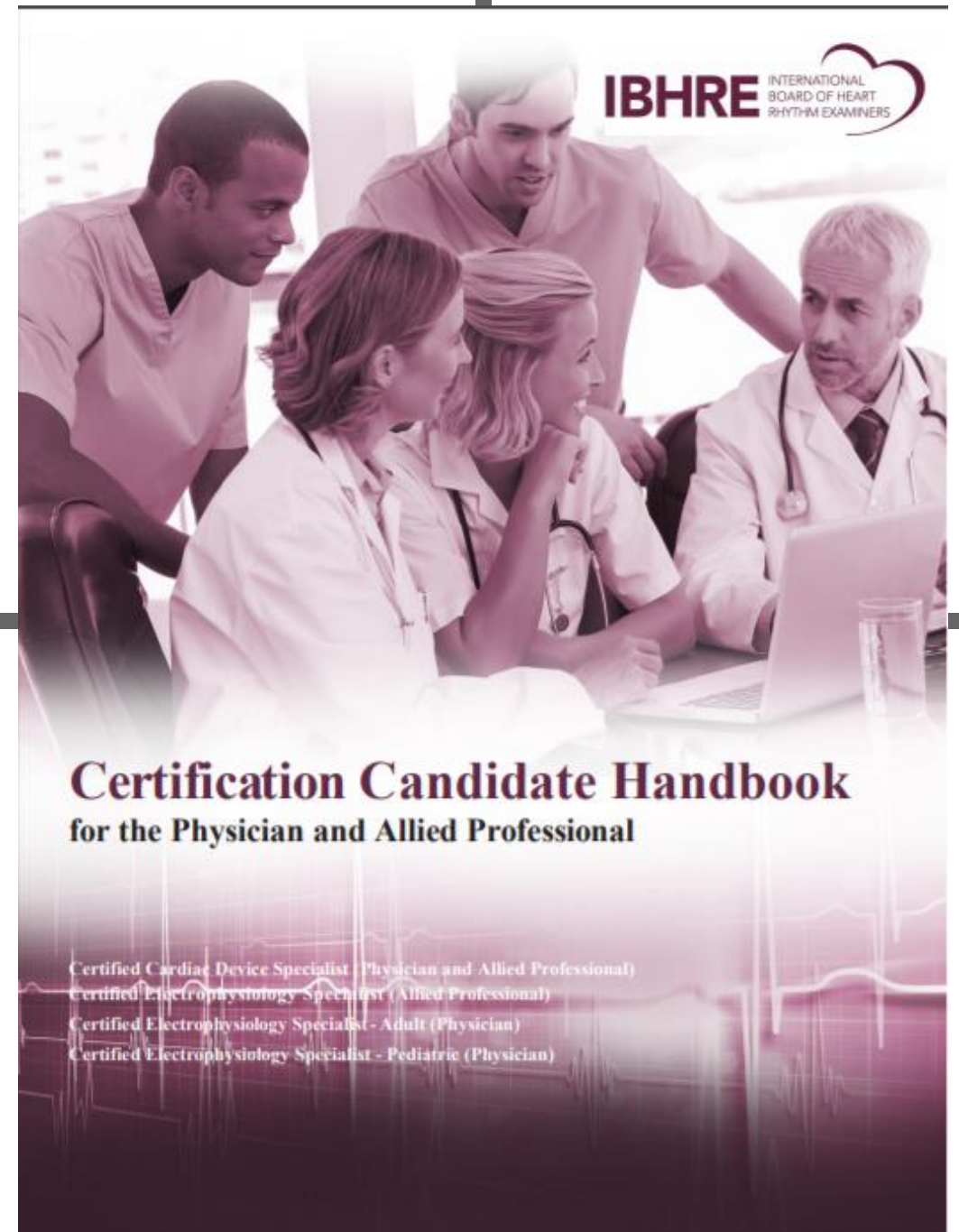
My tips;

# FYI; Verification of Continuing Education

The IBHRE Verification of Continuing Education (VCE) promotes enhancement of the knowledge and skills essential to the delivery of optimal patient care through career-long learning.

Five (5) years after passing the exam, certified professionals must attest to having completed 45 contact hours of professional activities that are applicable to their IBHRE certification.
